## International agreements for better working conditions at sea

From April 7 to 11, 2025, the fifth meeting of the Special Tripartite Committee (STC) [+](#) under the Maritime Labour Convention (MLC) [+](#) was held in Geneva. This meeting, organized by the International Labour Organization (ILO) [+](#), brought together representatives from governments, shipowners, and seafarers.

The STC is tasked with ensuring the proper application of the MLC and aligning it with new developments in the maritime sector where necessary.

During the meeting, agreement was reached on several important amendments to the convention. These include:

- Providing shore leave for seafarers
- Facilitating crew changes at port states and granting access to medical care ashore
- The costs of crew changes
- Medical care onboard
- “Fair Treatment” of seafarers in the event of an investigation following a maritime incident or during a criminal investigation
- Preventing and eliminating violence and harassment onboard.

These amendments will be officially adopted by the ILO on **June 6, 2025** and are expected to come into force by **the end of 2027**.



Additionally, a resolution was adopted calling for a meeting of the Joint ILO/IMO Tripartite Working Group. This working group will address the working and rest hours of seafarers, a subject that falls under the responsibility of both the ILO and the IMO.

On behalf of the KVNR, Jeaninne Haijemaïje and Tjitso Westra participated in the meeting as members of the Shipowners' Group. Sascha Meijer of Nautilus International participated as a member of the Seafarers' Group. The Dutch government was represented by Paul Vinkenleugel of the Ministry of Social Affairs and Employment
