Ship of the Year Award

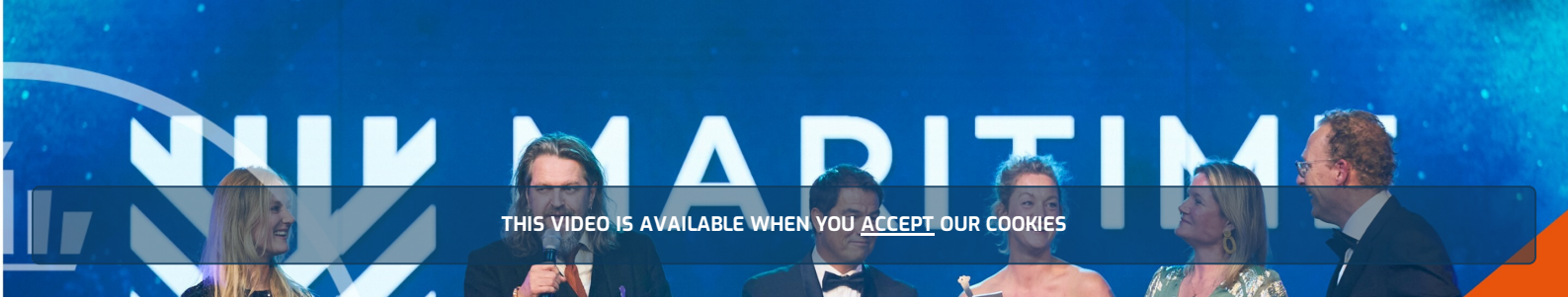
